Recruitment and appointment of committee members

All of the Association's committee members are appointed at our Annual General Meeting, which is held at the end of each financial year. In the event of a resignation of a committee member the vacancy may be filled by a member co-opted by the committee.

Governing document

The Association is a registered SCIO and the purposes and administration arrangements are set out in our constitution.

Charitable purposes

The provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended. The relief of those in need by reason of age, ill health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage.

Autism Rocks (Fife) was founded in March of 2014 initially as a Facebook Support Group. We set up due to the severe lack of provision and support for those living with Autism and their families.

Our mission was to see Fife as a place where people with Autism and their families are accepted as valued members of the community. We aimed to open a centre where we could promote and provide understanding, acceptance, inclusion, education and offer support to children and adults with autism, their families, the wider community, health professionals and education.

By September of 2014, we had become a fully registered charitable organisation. We provide help, support and advice to those living with Autism and their families.

In January of 2016, Kaleidoscope was born here in Buckhaven.

Since opening our doors, we have had 10293 visitors to our centre, and our external activities have supported 1762 and in June of 2017 we built the Aurora Sensory Garden, which incorporates both sensory and physical activities. Both being the first of their kind in Fife. We have our sensory room, arts and crafts, soft play, and many other activities available as well as a fantastic resource library where books can be borrowed that cover a whole range of matters relating to autism.

Through our Facebook group we support over 1890 families from all over Fife. Total volunteer hours since opening is 3201.50 not including our external activities which equates to a cost of approximately £24612.42.

Within Kaleidoscope, we provide 3 drop in sessions per week on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 10am until 2pm for all to attend be it parents, carers, professionals and family.

We have our newly formed Home Education group on a Monday from 10am until 1pm.

On a Thursday evening from 5.30pm until 7.30pm we have our Youth Group for ages 5 to 12.

On a Friday evening from 6pm until 8pm we have our teen/adult group for ages 13 and upwards.

On a Saturday we have our family days for all to attend from 10.30am until 1.30pm.

Once a month we have pool parties in 3 separate locations as well as a monthly trampoline session.

Activities and achievements

This financial year through our drop in, youth group, teen group and family days, we have supported 3607 people.

Our external activities have allowed us to support 542 people. Our volunteer hours for this financial year was 1821.75 which equates to a cost of approximately £14264 based on the living wage.

Our activities during the year included a session with the B activ roadshow in April which was very well attended and enjoyed.

We had a visit from cool creatures in July which was attended by over 70 people. It was a fantastic success.

We held a family barbeque in August which was very well attended by many.

We also had Halloween parties for our families.

We held a teen and adult social event at Frankie and Benny's in December which was attended by 36 individuals.

Our Xmas party on the 22nd of December was again, very well attended with a visit from Santa.

We held two pantomime sessions for our families, one in December and one in January which was an autism friendly session. Both sessions allowed 143 individuals to attend.

We had an easter party attended by the easter bunny and a face painter.

We had the privilege of being nominated into the Scottish Charity Awards as well as the National Diversity Awards which was in itself was an amazing achievement.

We also had the honour of being invited along to the Royal Garden Party at Holyrood Palace in recognition of our work.

Other charitable donations from:

Members, Families and Friends fundraising through sponsorship at events such as pool tournaments, A Hawaiian themed night, and golfing tournaments. Church collections and funeral donations were also received.

We did white water rafting and some fabulous young girls had a sponsored hair cut to raise funds for us.

The St Andrews Ball also made a donation to us. We attended the evening.

We have also been part of the Co Op community fund this financial year.

We have also received donations from Rotary club and Diageo.

As well as many other events throughout the year.

Committee members' remuneration and expenses

The committee members did not receive any remuneration during the year and all expenses were supported by accompanying receipts.

Reserves

As a result of the cash surplus of £4,107 (2018, deficit £5,450) for the year, the Association held unrestricted funds totalling £15,301 (2018, £11,194), including designated funds of £6,000 (2018 £6,000).
